## Emergency Instructions

At Stanlow, we have five sirens to alert our neighbouring communities to potentially serious incidents on-site. In the extremely unlikely event of an incident, these sirens would be sounded with a variable pitch similar to an air raid warning.

After an incident is concluded, the 'all clear' siren can be heard as a continuous tone.

### ON-SITE SIREN TESTING

- Every Monday at 09:00 hrs.
- Every Wednesday at 10:00 hrs.

### OFF-SITE SIREN TESTING

- **Elton, Ince and Thornton-le-Moors**, sounds at 11:00 hrs on the first Saturday of every month.
- **Innospec/Indigo Road and Stanney Mill Road**, sounds at 11:00 hrs on the first Thursday of every month.

Please ensure you listen for the test sirens and familiarise yourself with the tones described above. You may hear other sirens outside these times, however the off-site siren is the only one that requires you to take action.

### STAYING SAFE IN AN EMERGENCY

**GO IN** - Go inside, close outside doors and windows and shut off any ventilation systems. Where possible, go to an upper floor.

**STAY IN** - Do not go outdoors until you hear the 'all clear' siren (continuous tone), or you are advised to do so by the Emergency Services.
